Criteria & Guidelines:

- This scholarship is available to current/future High School senior students, college students, trade school students, or those enrolled in a master's program. The student must either be a member of CFFCU, have family that are members of CFFCU, or the student must reside in the CFFCU Field of membership area.
- Student grade point average requirement is 3.0 or above.
- Preference will be given to those applicants that can show participation in community events, volunteerism, and involvement in their community.
- Scholarship payment will be made to the scholarship winner after completion of first semester and upon proof of matriculation for next semester (if applicable).
- Applicants may be attending a 2-year or 4-year program at a community college or university, continuing education, or participating in education for a skilled trade/GTE.
