 - Tri County High School seniors who will be attending a community college, university, or a vocational, technology, or trade program.
- Student grade point average requirement is 2.5 or above.
- Preference will be given to those students that can show participation in community events, volunteerism, and involvement in their community.
- Scholarship payment will be made to the scholarship winner after completion of the first semester of college or trade school and upon proof of matriculation for the second semester. Applicants may be attending a community college, university, or vocational program.
- Application materials will be placed on the Community First Website, in each of the Community First Branches, and in Tri County High School.
- The Community First Scholarship must be used within 12 months of being received.
- Completed application, transcript, and two letters of recommendation may be submitted in the following ways:
